What can Collaborative Apprenticeships do for my business?

The West Yorkshire Consortium of Colleges is offering fully funded (free) training courses for businesses in the Leeds City Region* to support managers and future managers of apprentices.

The project is funded by the European Social Fund and businesses can access a range of quality training courses from local colleges at no cost.

The aim of the Collaborative Apprenticeships project is to increase the number of apprentices and improve the quality of apprenticeships in this region.

The courses on offer can help to develop management skills that will give an improved experience to apprentices. The courses are designed to build confidence and knowledge in managers and supervisors to get the best from apprentices and staff.

What is on offer?

- Key training courses in topical issues such as climate change and sustainability in the workplace, mental health first aid and resource efficiencies.
- Fundamental management skills including mentoring, leadership and management (ILM) and communicating with your team (including apprentices).
- Workshops and support to navigate the digital apprenticeship recruitment and management system for businesses who don't know where to start.

Is my business eligible for the funded training?

We'd like to hear from managers and budding managers within businesses who are interested in taking on apprentices, or those who already employ apprentices. There is no restriction on which sector.

Individuals applying for these courses need to be over 16 and live or work in *Bradford, Calderdale, Craven, Harrogate, Kirklees, Leeds, Selby, Wakefield or York districts.
